THE HOPPERS



We will be walking the Evergreen Nature Trail to see wildlife and all the flowers bloom, visiting our tree we adopted that we will care for and play with (reading it books, drawing pictures of it, etc.), and playing more organized games like t-ball when outside on the playground. We are also planning the summer's activities, so be on the lookout for that later this month! For May themes we will be discussing Butterflies and Frogs, Pond Life, and Insects.

When he can follow the pattern, draw larger or more complex ones. Make fun shapes, such as a teddy bear or a train!
